Taking a Caddie for the First Time

For many members, arranging and playing with a caddie for the first time can feel a bit intimidating—but there's no need to worry. Playing a round of golf with a caddie not only enhances the experience but often leaves players eager to do it again. It's also worth remembering that each time you take a caddie, you're providing a valuable job opportunity for a young person.

How to Arrange for a Caddie:

- When booking a tee time through the first tee, simply let them know that you'd like to take a caddie.
- If you're hosting guests and would like caddies for the group, please inform us of your guests' golf abilities. This helps us match the group with appropriate caddies.
- For tournaments, please contact the first tee at least one week in advance if you wish to have a caddie. We kindly ask that you not request the same caddie for every tournament.

Caddie Expectations:

Please remember to evaluate your caddie based on the responsibilities aligned with their classification. For example, it's not fair to expect an A Caddie to perform at the level of an Honor Caddie, nor should an Honor Caddie deliver only the services expected of an A Caddie.
