

Caddie Pay Rates

Caddie rates are based on the caddie's level of experience. At Red Run, a beginner caddie is a trainee. To become an "A" caddie you will need a minimum of 10 loops or 5 excellent member recommendations and a review with the Caddie Manager. A beginner caddie moves up to an "A" Caddie. This caddie is still relatively new and just learning the responsibilities of being a caddie. The next level of caddie is a "Captain" Caddie. A Captain Caddie has been at the club caddying for a minimum of 1 ½ to 2 years. This caddie manages his/her player's bag, assists younger caddies in the group, helps the golf staff with pace of play, and maintaining the course. The highest-level caddie at Red Run is an "Honor" Caddie. The Honor Caddie has the most experience of any caddie at the club. They will manage their player's bag, manage the younger caddies in their group, assist the caddie master with training, and assist the golf staff with daily set-up, speed of play, and maintenance of the golf course.

Each caddie level is assigned an all-in payment rate range with tips included. Additional tips are optional but not required. Caddie ranks have been listed from highest to lowest rank.

<u>Honor</u>	-	18 holes \$68 - \$75 / 9 holes \$35 - \$40
<u>Captain</u>	-	18 holes \$58 - \$65 / 9 holes \$30 - \$35
<u>A</u>	-	18 holes \$48 - \$55 / 9 holes \$25 - \$30
<u>Trainee</u>	-	18 holes \$38 - \$45 / 9 holes \$20 - \$25
