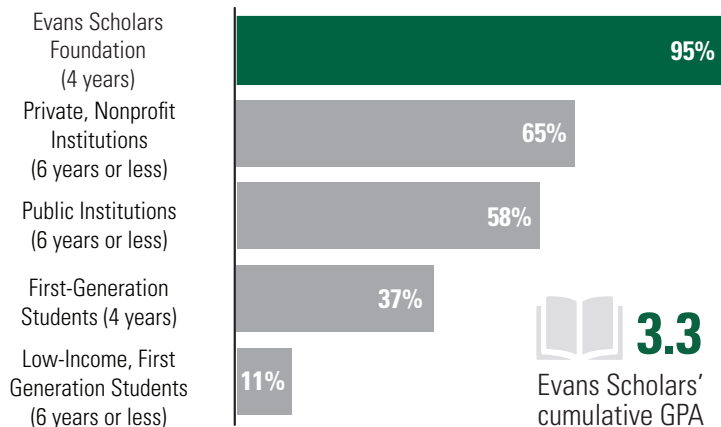
By The Numbers

Red Run Golf Club has a rich tradition with the Western Golf Association and the Evans Scholars Foundation dating back to 1952 when Bob McMasters became our first caddie to be awarded an Evans Scholarship. Moreover, in the over 120-year history of the WGA only two men from the State of Michigan have been elected Chairman and both are members of Red Run G.C - Bob McMasters, 1996-97 and David Robinson, 2016-17. The Foundation is supporting seven Evans Scholars from the Club in the 2022-23 academic year. WGA's golf championships rank among the oldest and most prestigious in the U.S. with Red Run proudly hosting the 1958 Western Open and the 2016 Western Junior.

PROGRAM OUTCOMES

EVANS SCHOLARS GRADUATE at a rate of 95% significantly higher than the national averages for the student populations our Program serves.

Comparison of Graduation Rates

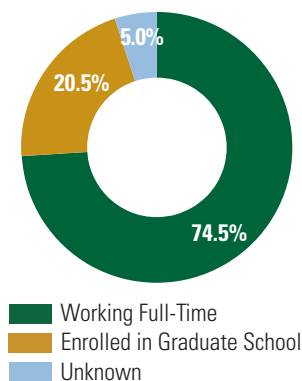

This far exceeds the success rates of their non-Evans Scholar peers and truly demonstrates the life-changing impact of the Evans Scholarship.

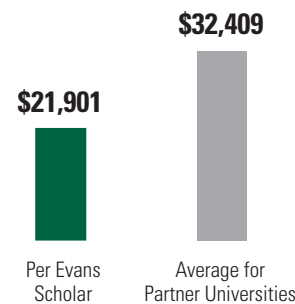
Evans Scholars 6 Months after Graduation

Evans Scholarship Eligibility & Evaluation Criteria

To be eligible to apply for an Evans Scholarship for caddies, candidates must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Strong caddie record:** Applicants must have caddied, regularly and successfully, for a minimum of two years and are expected to caddie at their sponsoring club the year they apply for the Evans Scholarship.
- 2. Excellent academics:** Applicants must have completed their junior year of high school with above a B average in college preparatory courses.
- 3. Demonstrated financial need:** Applicants must clearly have a need for financial assistance.
- 4. Outstanding character:** Applicants must be outstanding in character, integrity and leadership.
