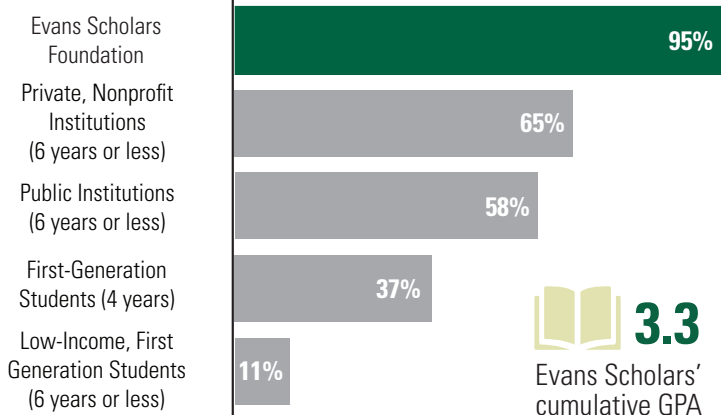
By The Numbers

Red Run Golf Club has a rich tradition with the Western Golf Association and the Evans Scholars Foundation dating back to 1952 when Life Member Bob McMasters became our first caddie to be awarded an Evans Scholarship. Moreover, in the 120-year history of the WGA only two men from the State of Michigan have been elected Chairman and both are members of Red Run G.C - Bob McMasters, 1996-97 and David Robinson, 2016-17. The Foundation is supporting nine Scholars from the Club in the 2018-19 academic year with two newly awarded Scholars set to begin school in the fall of 2019. WGA's golf championships rank among the oldest and most prestigious in the U.S. with Red Run proudly hosting the 1958 Western Open and the 2016 Western Junior.

PROGRAM OUTCOMES

EVANS SCHOLARS GRADUATE at a rate of 95 percent in approximately four years, significantly higher than the national averages for the student populations our Program serves.

Comparison of Graduation Rates

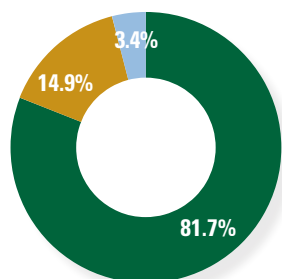

Evans Scholars 6 Months after Graduation

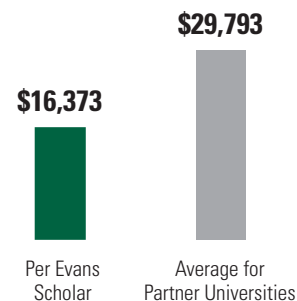
